

The PE and School Sport Premium Spending Plan 2018-19 and Impact Review

In June 2013 the Government announced the allocation of £150million per annum. The funding has been allocated to Primary Schools to “improve the quality and breadth of Physical Education and Sport Provision, including increasing participation so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.” The PE and School Sport Premium is part of a joint strategy supported and funded by the Department for Education (DfE), Department for Health (DfH) and the Department for Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS).

Tuxford Primary Academy has been allocated £18,650 for the academic year 2018–2019. This money has been used specifically to fund a PE specialist to work as a teacher and to fund an additional lunchtime play focused support. The idea for this came from the children through our School Council, as they wanted to improve behaviour in the playground. Although behaviour at Tuxford Primary Academy is extremely good, we noticed that the majority of problems and upsets stemmed from the football pitch. Tempers flared over missed goals and soon. By employing additional support we have radically reduced the number of behaviour incidents.

At Tuxford Primary Academy, we are committed to providing high quality PE and sport to all children. We also recognise the significant impact PE and sport can have on a child’s health, self-esteem and consequently on their passion to learn.

Aside from activities funded through this grant, the school has expanded sports provision significantly during the past three years. Please see table below for a breakdown of PE activities which supplement class lessons and their costs.
