## A day at the academy

The academy day starts at 8.45am, with a morning break and a staggered lunchtime to ensure all pupils are able to eat in comfort and with friends from their year group. The day ends at 3.10pm for key stage 1 pupils and 3.15pm for key stage 2 pupils. If they are attending one of our free extracurricular clubs, these end at 4.15pm.

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#### Break time

There are two playgrounds at the academy and two large fields that have plenty of use throughout the year. All playtimes are supervised by dedicated staff and we encourage wet and messy play as an important part of the social and physical development of your child.

#### Lunchtime

A wide range of playground games are participated in during lunchtime and we have a great team of midday supervisors to ensure all children are safe and happy.





#### Breakfast club

To support parents and carers, we run a breakfast club\* each morning from 7.30am. Children are given a nutritious breakfast and have access to activities which are organised for them by our extended services team, including puzzles, drawing, board games and iPads. Some children use the time for daily reading or homework. Children who are eligible for Pupil Premium can attend breakfast club free of charge.

#### After-school club

We also offer an after-school club\* five days a week from 3.15pm to 6pm. Pupils have access to a range of pre-planned and timetabled activities such as baking, painting and model making. Activities are changed every term to ensure variety and allow children to try new experiences. All children get an afternoon tea, such as a chicken wrap, soup or beans on toast, and a drink.

#### Enrichment

We run a wide range of activities and clubs for our pupils and are one of the only primary academies in Nottinghamshire to offer graded ballet exams, as well as oneto-one graded music tuition.
