The principal stated TPA will continue to engage with sporting events at TA with all classes attending at least one. There has been an increased number of after school clubs aiding the development of leadership roles/responsibilities for children.

SATs result 2025

The acting principal was delighted to share with governors the SATs 2025 results for TPA confirming they were the highest combined in the Trust. The children were to be commended Y6 tackled SATs papers with maturity and enthusiasm. Arriving each day for breakfast and then relaxed by singing and dancing with their classmates. On Thursday they celebrated with games and afternoon tea.

Governors thanked the staff for their support and engagement with the children during this time.

A governor asked the MTC tables test for children with FSM is this to do with the lack of availability of timetable and access to IT. The acting principal replied the academy hold a multiplication club within the school which has helped enormously.

Behaviour

There had been 3 suspensions year to date relating to 2 children Achievement behaviours are new for this year. The positive achievement behaviours are visible to parents through the Weduc app. There have been teething issues and these are being resolved.

A governor asked what is in place to stop the fixed term suspensions. The acting principal replied, strategies have been put in place and shared across the school.

Attendance

Above average

It was noted Nora Virus and Chicken pox had caused a significant number of absences.

SEND

A governor asked what APDR represent. The acting principal replied The '**Assess, Plan, Do, Review**' cycle is a good way for schools to plan special educational needs (SEN) support. It is also called the 'graduated approach. Building a picture and profile for children with SEND needs.

A governor stated the SEND dashboard is a very useful tool.

Personal Development

Transition to new classes has taken place and transition events have been attended by Y6 including additional transition for those who would benefit from additional time and links to Tuxford Academy.

Other opportunities this term have included Year 2 visit to Sherwood Pines, whole school engagement in National Numeracy Day, Year 4/5 Bassetlaw Museum (pilgrims and their journey to the new world), Year 6 national Civil War centre, Rounders and cricket festival at TA, Athletics festival at TA, Retford Swimming -an assembly about water safety.

The academy continue the commitment to engage in sporting activities at TA and ROA this term. Cooking club now has regular attenders. Sports premium The acting principal reported on the sport premium and the grants attached to this subject. Further reporting on CPD, Internal Sports and External sports, opportunities, impacts and sustainability details. Premier Education, external providers have been working with teachers to deliver PE sessions. Following a brief discussion The Chair approved the application for the continuation of grants.
